A Zoning Bylaw Amendment has been submitted to the City for the properties at 566-578 Colborne Street. The owner is proposing to construct two, 3-storey stacked townhouses behind the existing houses. The two houses would remain, with three units in each, for a total of 18 units on the two properties. A public meeting will be held before the Planning and Environment Committee on October 22, 1pm at City Hall. Karen's Place ~ A transitional home in our community

In memory of local business woman and philanthropist, Karen Crich, Karen's Place, a transitional home for women 50+, and located in Woodfield, was opened in August 2023. Statistics show that women of this age group are often overlooked and underserved in the social services system.

Currently, there are six residents in six rooms each with its own linen supply and unique décor. The residents cook for themselves and have access to a quiet room, craft supplies, books, and a den with a TV.

As part of their Giving Back/Micro-Business program, the residents cater a monthly lunch for a church group. The outdoor area provides a recently donated picnic table and an over-size planter which will be filled with herbs, flowers, and vegetables.

A full-time CMHA worker is on premises. Other supports are accessed as needed. The goal is to find permanent housing for the residents. There have recently been two "graduates".

It's official and our new sign confirms it; Lord Roberts is now called Woodfield French Immersion Public School. A great choice of name. Woodfield French Immersion Public School began as Princess Avenue Public School in 1883, the original was torn down and re-built in 1915 for what it is today.
